Breeding history

Arena I was bred by utilising Mediterranean germplasm crossed with climatically adapted American material. The high winter activity of the Mediterranean germplasm means Arena I is able to continue growing in the colder months when other grasses have stopped. It has a high endophyte level, giving it resistance to many insects and pests. The inclusion of American genetics also gives the cultivar excellent summer performance.

Sowing rate and maintenance

Arena I turf ryegrass can be sown at 30 - 50 g/m² (300 - 500 kg/ha). Use the higher seeding rate for faster establishment.

In new sports fields and winter over-seeded couchgrass, it should be sown at 400 - 500 kg/ha.
