



Manor browntop

Key features:

- Outstanding fineness and density
- Light green colour which helps mask *Poa annua* invasion
- Can be used for all parts of a golf course
- Especially suitable for greens
- Suitable for low or high maintenance lawns

The fineness and density of Manor browntop produces putting greens of outstanding quality. It displays a light green colour which aids the masking of *Poa annua* present in a sward. Manor browntop can be used for greens, tees, fairways and roughs and is also a good choice for low or high maintenance lawns where superior quality is desired.

Breeding history

Manor was bred in New Zealand by Dr Alan Stewart of PGG Wrightson Turf. It is a selection out of Sefton and has a similar colour and leaf texture to Sefton. Sefton was bred from plugs of the best browntop that superintendents were invited to send in from their greens. The best lighter green coloured plants from New Zealand were selected as parents.

Sowing rate and maintenance

Sow Manor at 5 - 10 g/m² (50 - 100 kg/ha) when sown alone or in mixtures with fine fescue.

For overseeding of existing turf 2.5 - 5 g/m² (25 - 50 kg/ha) is recommended.
