



Minimus hard fescue

Key features:

- Reduced fertility requirements
- Reduced water usage
- Reduced mowing frequency
- Great for environmentally sensitive sites
- Excellent shade tolerance

Minimus hard fescue offers several options on the golf course and in general, natural low maintenance turf areas with A-LIST quality. It thrives under low maintenance management and is ideal for parks, primary and secondary roughs, as well as in areas where turf transitions to natural areas or into shade. With low fertiliser and water inputs, a mowing at the seed head extension period (mid-May – mid-June) is often the only mowing required.

Minimus is excellent for use in mixtures with wildflowers and native grasses. With low seeding rates, Minimus will not form super dense and heavy thatch sod and will not out-compete other desirable species.

Sowing rate and maintenance

Sowing rate for lawns and parks is 30 - 50 g/m² (300 - 500 kg/ha). Cover seed to a depth not exceeding 6mm and keep seedlings moist until well rooted. The first mowing should be when the grass blades reach a length of 50 mm; mow back to 30 mm until turf is established. The establishment rate is slow with full coverage not expected until 14 weeks after sowing or longer.
