TifBlair™ has a good tolerance to cooler weather and can be used in dappled shade situations. It can be used in a range of situations such as sports fields, lawns and landscaping, passive park areas, roadside batters and road verges.

Breeding history

TifBlair™ was bred by Dr Wayne Hanna from the University of Georgia using selections taken from Blairsville, Georgia. It was released in 1997.

Sowing rate and maintenance

TifBlair™ should be sown at 5 - 10 g/m² (50 - 100 kg/ha) into a well prepared seedbed when ground temperatures exceed 18°C. It is recommended that sufficient starter fertiliser is applied to the soil surface to provide adequate nutrients to the germinating seeds. TifBlair™ should be mown at no shorter than 35 mm.
